Address Data Update 1/95

The Royal Mail have now released the first update to the PAF file data for 1995 (1/95), and this has been extracted and prepared for use with AFD's Postcode products.

As well as inclusion of major changes to postcodes in the Reading area, update 1/95 also includes postcodes in the Channel Islands (GY=Guernsey and JE=Jersey), Isle of Man (IM) and GIR (Girobank, Bootle) postcodes, and the new HS postcodes covering the Western Isles of Scotland. This data is now provided with all new copies of Postcode ordered from AFD.

The AFD team have not only included all the extra information in the new data set, but have also reduced the space required for your Postcode installation at the same time! The new data DLL files now require around 20 megabytes instead of 24. All facilities offered by our programs remain, though users of our Windows DLL and stand-alone Postcode program must use new versions of these programs with the new data.

Existing Postcode users are invited to apply for an interim data update, at the nominal cost of £30 + VAT. This update also includes a **free update** to latest releases of program files.

To order your update, simply phone Margaret on (01294 823221) or fax your order (01294 822905), quoting your Postcode serial number and credit card details, or post your cheque for £35.25 to the address overleaf.

Please note that the update pack runs from Windows and installs both DOS and Windows versions. It will only operate with a properly installed copy of Postcode! If you cannot install an update from Windows, please order the DOS-only update pack which costs $\pounds 50 + VAT$ (total $\pounds 58.75$).

With the possibility of release of a new drug to help fight against this major disease, the Multiple Sclerosis Society quickly saw the advantage of building AFD Postcode into the help-desk system they were developing to provide assistance to members.

David Pearse, who met AFD at the Windows Show in Olympia earlier this year, reported that the programming team were delighted with the ease with which Postcode could be built into their application - which is being built with Microsoft Access, Visual Basic and SQL server.

Making it easy......

Throughout 1995, the AFD technical boffins have been steadily working through lots of PC database programs and programming languages to provide ready-built code for incorporating Postcode technology in a range of applications.

There seems to be no good reason why every developer should have to work out how to interface with the *Fast Addressing* technology of AFD Postcode, so in very many cases we can give you free examples and source code to use in your own project.

The table opposite lists all the applications and languages which we know Postcode works with. It is not exhaustive, and most applications, even where not specifically mentioned, can use Postcode's ability to type into the keyboard buffer to receive an address - in both DOS and Windows. Almost every Windows programming language can use the Postcode DLL, to provide 'invisible' fast addressing, and simple postcode look-up. The DLL uses only one function call to carry out all its tasks!

Where we have developed a specific example or special solution for an application, this is clearly shown on the table. AFD already ship a wide range of these examples with both the evaluation and full Postcode products, but the team have been building a library of routines for some less common ones as well. Many of these are available free of charge from the AFD Bulletin Board on 01294 829327.

Under AFD's Developer/VAR scheme, the AFD team will consider producing specific solutions for any un-supported application or language - providing the potential market for the solution is reasonable. This service is completely free of charge to members of the scheme. We have already successfully introduced new solutions for five of our Developer/VAR members, in both DOS and Windows.


