Spelling mistakes, poorly structured and inaccurate data lead to lower service standards. Along with speed, Pocket Postcode brings improved accuracy and a consistent data structure. 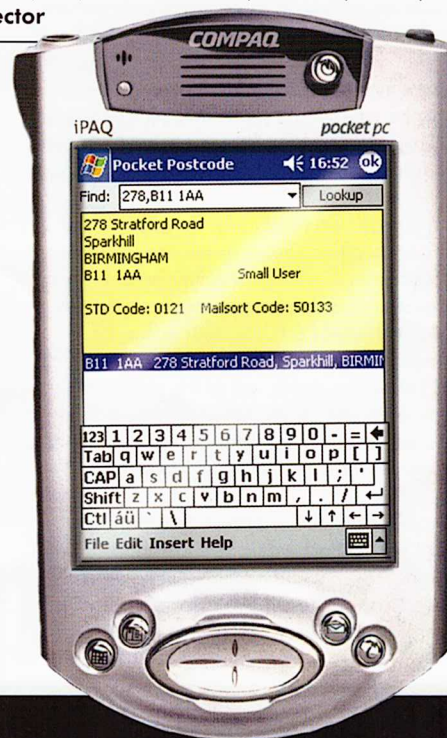

Pocket Postcode to raise package delivery standards

The new Pocket Postcode package from AFD looks set to revolutionise the parcel delivery market. Already undergoing trials by two of the largest parcel carriers in the UK, the software ensures reliable and accurate address data is collected - with significant cost savings for the carrier and improved first time delivery performance for the customer.

The UK overnight delivery market is big business in the UK. Employing over 100,000 people and moving an estimated 4.5 million parcels every night, ensuring accurate delivery data is vital to ensuring parcels are delivered to the right customer at the right time.

The single biggest reason for misrouted parcels is inaccurate address data collection. This is typically done at the time the parcel is picked up from the customer. The driver takes basic information about the consignments being picked up - often using paper or rudimentary handheld computer systems.

Postcodes can easily be mistyped - SL1 can easily be typed in as LS1 - and suddenly a package destined for Slough ends up in Leeds, hundreds of miles from its intended destination.

It's a stressful and busy job. Between 4 and 6pm every afternoon, a driver can do upwards of 30 customer visits, collecting parcels ready for overnight distribution throughout the UK. The driver needs a quick, simple way of collecting the consignment information which won't slow him down, yet at the same time offers a degree of validation to ensure the consignment gets delivered to the right place at the right time.

A proof-of-collection system incorporating AFD's Pocket Postcode offers just that. By typing in the destination postcode, the street address for the consignment can be shown for instant verification. If the postcode is wrong,

the driver has the opportunity of re-entering it. If the postcode given to the driver is incorrect, then the driver can either enter the street name and town to check a list of possible postcodes, or put the parcel aside for checking later.



Either way, a costly parcel misroute is avoided.

The payback is immense - and immediate. Most major parcel carriers estimate that the average cost to them for delivering a misrouted package is between £80-£140. That price includes finding the consignment again, liaising with the customer, rerouting the consignment back to the correct destination depot and delivering it to the intended recipient by the end of the same business day.

The ability to roll out Pocket Postcode on handheld computers already in use by carriers means that the system can be implemented quickly, ensuring it can start paying for itself, financially, and more importantly brings instant improvements to customer service.

Is your name and address data

THE CASE FOR ADDRESS MANAGEMENT SOFTWARE

1. No address validation?

- Poor spelling
- Inconsistent data formatting
- Missing, wrong or incomplete postcodes.
- Ambiguous address information
- Address entry takes up to five times longer

- Full, accurate postcode.
- Validated against the Royal Mail PAF file.
- Consistently formatted for easy analysis, searching and sorting.
- Correctly spelled and formatted for professional presentation.

Did you know - that an address like "Station Road, Preston" occurs in at least 11 different parts of the UK!
